Health Clinic Report

The 2014 Health Clinic was held March 9 at Refugee Canyon West. We hit the ground running at 7:30 and Rich and I closed up shop at 5:30. We made a profit of \$1911.96. For a brief time, Chris Bell felt very wealthy because she handled over \$8000 that day! Dr. Metzler examined 145 dogs' eyes. Dr. Schober examined 71 dogs' hearts.

As I always say, we learn something every year to help it run more smoothly the subsequent year and this year was no exception. Due to various reasons we did get backed up a couple of times but most people were very understanding and accommodating. Some breeds have to be examined before and after the application of drops, which takes additional time and we had a few people who got lost and were late but we worked around it all.

We received many nice comments from participants once again this year: many come because of our location, others because of our pleasant doctors, and others were appreciative of the organization. What I can tell you is that I could not do this clinic without the much appreciated help that I had. Chris Bell did a fantastic job handling all the money, both intake and payout. Andrea Fitch did eye drops and people shuffling and her role got intensified since I had to send Dennis home for all the

PRODUCT	CANINE/DOG DOSAGE	FELINE/CAT DOSAGE	COMMON USE
Buffered Aspirin	5 mg per lb every 12 hrs	Not recommended	Pain relief, anti- inflammatory
Vitamin B	% to 2 ml subcutaneously every 24 hrs	½ to 1 ml subcutaneously every 24 hrs	Used as an appetite stimulant
Benadryl	Up to 2 mg per lb every 8 hrs	Up to 2 mg per lb every 8 hrs	Treat allergies, itching, etc.
Dramamine	Up to 50 mg every 8 hrs	Up to 10 mg every 8 hrs	Used to reduce motion (car) sickness
Hydrogen Peroxide 3%	10 ml by mouth every 15 minutes	10 ml by mouth every 15 minutes	Used to induce vomiting after accidental ingestion of poison
Cpinephrine 1:1000	1/10 to ½ ml intramuscular or subcutaneously	1/10 to 2/10 ml intramuscular or subcutaneously	Used to treat reactions following insect stings, bites or medications
Pepto Bismal	1 teaspoon per 5 lbs every 6 hrs	Not recommended	Used to relieve vomiting or stomach gas, diarrhea
Di Gel Liquid	Up to 4 tablespoons every 8 hrs	Up to 2 tablespoons every 8 hrs	Antacid and anti-gas
Mineral Oil	Up to 4 tablespoons daily	Up to 2 teaspoons daily	Used to eliminate constipation
Kaopectate	1 ml per lb every 2 hrs	1 ml per lb every 2 hrs	For diarrhea
Tylenol (Acteminophin)	Not recommended	Not recommended	Not recommended

The following are common antibiotic medications prescribed by veterinarians. Do not use outdated medications and ALWAYS follow the advice of your veterinarian when using antibiotics.

Antibiotic Medications

PRODUCT	CANINE/DOG DOSAGE	FELINE/CAT DOSAGE	COMMON USE
Amoxicillin	5 mg per lb every 12 hrs	5 mg per lb daily	Used to treat bacterial infections
Ampicillin	10 mg per lb every 6 hrs	10 mg per lb every 6 hrs	Used to treat bacterial Infections
Tetracycline	10 mg per lb every 8 hrs	10 mg per lb every 8 hrs	Used to treat bacterial infections
PEN BP 48 each ml includes 150,000 units each of penicillin G. Benzathine/Penicillin G. Procaine	1 cc per 20 lbs every 48 hrs subcutaneously	Not recommended	Used to treat bacterial infections
Procaine Penicillin 300,000 units per ml	1 ml per 30 lbs subcutaneously	1 ml per 30 lbs subcutaneously	Antibiotic to fight bacterial infections
Erythromycin tablets	5 mg per lb every 8 hrs	5 mg per lb every 8 hrs	Antibiotic to fight bacterial infections
